**Excerpts** from Pat Wojhan,  
Chair, National Meet Committee:

"The Buick Club of America Board of Directors has decided to cancel the 2021 Dual Meet scheduled for June/July this summer. The National Meet Committee (NMC) held several meetings with the board to review the current public health guidance related to the pandemic and the impact on the event.

These guidelines included capacity restrictions and face covering mandates both indoors and outdoors along with contact tracing and health check requirements. After much discussion, careful consideration and an overabundance of caution, the board decided to cancel the meets this summer. Strongsville and Charlotte/Concord are excellent locations to host National Meets therefore the BOD and NMC will be working with the local chapters and hotels to determine their interest in hosting a meet in future years.

The majority of the BCA membership's demographic is considered in the "vulnerable population" and consequently at a higher risk for the COVID-19 virus. Naturally, this vulnerability leads seniors to be very concerned for their safety if attending a mass gathering event such as a national meet."

The 2022 BCA National Meet will be held in Lisle, IL.

The Fall Tour is on! New dates: October 18-22, 2021. Huntsville, Alabama.

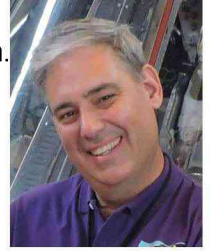

## EDITOR - PAULA LISKA - BDE #2

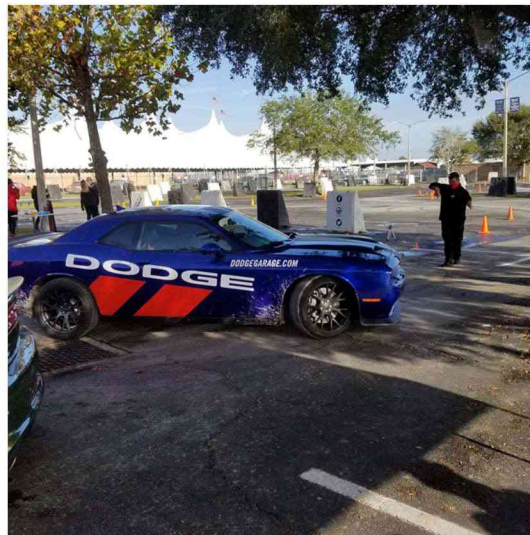

## **WELCOME TO THE BUICK CLUB!**

I harken back to my introduction to Buick Club of America. Back in the 80's, I lived close to my father, John Westfall in Ohio. Dad bought a 67 Riviera and whenever I came to the farm, I had a starter or carburetor to install. The Riviera was yellow then. It developed a bubble on the top of the right rear fender. Well, Dad handed me some sandpaper one Saturday and by the time I got down to metal I had gone through 4 colors of paint and primer. That culminated in taking the whole car down to metal and changing it to Verde Green as some of you know the car.



Well, I moved to Kansas City in 1988 and actually missed wrenching on the Riviera ... except for trips back to the farm at Thanksgiving or Christmas ... more wrenching.

In 91 or 92, the BCA was in Overland Park Kansas. Dad informed me that he was bringing the Riv and had done improvements to try for a Senior award. His thought was to get a Senior and sell it because he had his eye on a 47 Super in the Carolinas, and that was his college car.

Dad and Mom got to Overland Park the weekend before the show. I lifted the hood and saw red heater hoses, universal Radiator hoses, NAPA battery, Echlin distributor, wires and sparkplugs, and white Gabriel shocks. Guess what I did for 4 days!!! AC/Delco for everything, except I painted the white shocks black to look like AC shocks. Even painted the bottom of the car black and rear brake drums grey.

Saturday Judging day it spitted rain on and off. We wiped the car down 4 times and it was raining when the judges showed up. We ended up with 389 points, one less than Senior. I did not know about tower radiator clamps and had worm screw clamps on. Bummer!

Dad did not sell the Riv. Instead, he bought the 47 Super Convertible, 31 Phaeton, 71 Boat Tail, two 75 LeSabre Convertibles and the 47 Special 4-door fastback Restorod (but this car is a whole 'nother story)! Lots of wrenching whenever I got home on holidays.

Moving on to "Buicks are Fine in '99". Dad called a couple weeks ahead of the show and asked if I was doing anything! He needed someone to prep the 47, 67, and 71, as he was show chairman. So, I loaded up the family and went to Ohio.

Once I got the 3 cars prepped, driven 35 miles to the show, inspected, and pictures taken, I thought this show will be enjoyable. Wrong! Next, dad had me driving a golf cart taking people between the show field and the hotel. Next he said he needed me as a Judge! I said "Dad, I am not even a member of the Buick Club!" 15 minutes later I was a member! I went to Judges School and learned "Don't Kill the Car"

Through the years, I have attended BCA shows with my Mom and Dad from Seattle to Batavia, Rochester to Charlotte, and more shows in between.

Thanks Dad! I miss you and Mom!

So - who own's the car? The interview was done on Long Island . . .

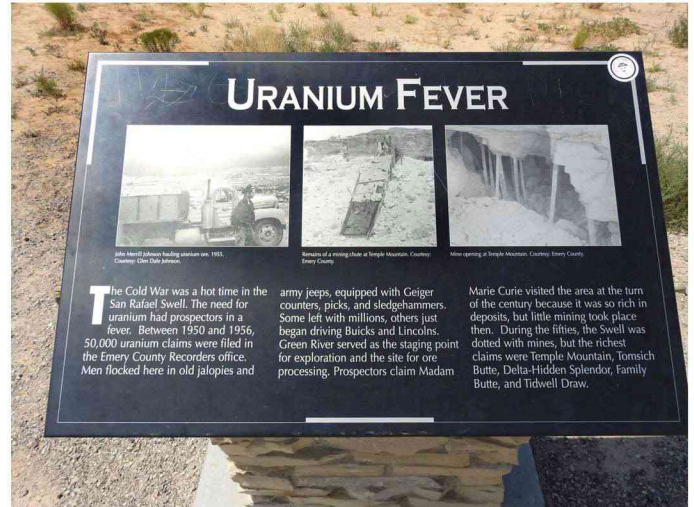

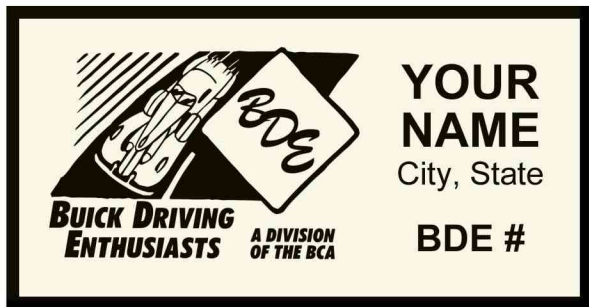
